2019 STATE HIGH SCHOOL SWIMMING & DIVING CHAMPIONSHIP FEBRUARY 8-9, 2019

HOST CLUB: Nashville Aquatic Club

LOCATION: Tracy Caulkins Competition Pool Centennial Sportsplex, 222 25th Ave North, Nashville, TN 37203

VENUE: Indoor 50 meter by 25 yard pool divided by two 4-foot wide bulkheads into two 25 yard pools. Competition pool 1 runs from 7 feet at starting end to 8 feet deep, Competition pool 2 runs from 12 feet at starting end to 8 ½ feet deep. The competition course has been certified in accordance with 104.2.2C(4). The copy of such certification is on file with USA Swimming. Separate warm down pool will be available.

RULES: Current National Federation of State High School Associations (NFSHA) Rules govern the conduct of these championships, except as modified by the TISCA Constitution and Bylaws, TISCA Championship Rules, or this Meet Invitation. It shall be the swimmers' and coaches' responsibility to acquaint themselves with all the information contained in the meet information.

OFFICIALS: All swimming officials must be currently certified and 2019 members of USA Swimming. Officials desiring an assigned position must submit an application on the 2019 TISCA Official Application <click here> to the meet referee by February 3, 2018. Dress code of white polo shirts with khaki bottoms will be worn for all prelim sessions. Oxford blue shirts with khaki slacks or skirts will be worn for all finals sessions. White socks & shoes will be worn for all sessions.

ELIGIBILITY: This Championship meet is open to current TISCA member teams and athletes in good standing (swimmers and divers in grades 9 through 12), and teams consisting of "Home School" athletes (grades 9 through 12), if meeting the requirements of Article VII and Article VIII and accepted by TISCA. All home school unattached swimmers must be a current member of TISCA. No State Championship entries will be accepted nor voting privileges granted to a team or unattached home school athlete unless current TISCA membership registration has been accepted and current dues have been paid. Registration forms and dues payment must be received **by TISCA** by the meet entry deadline.

Teams which fail to register with TISCA by the State Championship Meet entry deadline shall be allowed to participate under the following restrictions. Registration requires submission of all forms and payments. All swimmers, divers and relays shall only participate in the preliminary sessions of the State Championship Meet. No individual swimmers, divers, or relays will be eligible to advance to finals nor score points in the competition. The meet host may designate such individuals and relays as "exhibition" on the meet entry list in order to facilitate orderly meet management.

Athletes or relays which are entered by a team after the State Championship entry deadline shall be allowed to participate under the following restrictions:

All swimmers, divers and relays shall only participate in the preliminary sessions of the State Championship Meet. No late-entered individual swimmer, diver, or relay will be eligible to advance to finals nor score points in the competition. The meet host may designate such individuals and relays as "exhibition" on the meet entry list in order to facilitate orderly meet management.

No further entries or corrections shall be accepted after 11:59 PM on the Friday preceding the State Championship Meet.

CREDENTIALS: Coaches, athletes and officials are required to display credentials or a wristband to gain access to the pool deck. Credentials or wristbands will be provided at Team Check-In. Lost credentials or wristbands for swimmers or coaches can be replaced by a coach for \$5.00.

TEAM CHECK-IN: Coaches and teams must check-in and receive their team packet and wristbands before they will be allowed onto the pool deck. Early Check-In will be held on February 7, 2019 from 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm at Centennial Sportsplex. Coaches may also check-in prior to the preliminary sessions on Friday and Saturday 6:30 am – 8:30 am. Team packets and heat sheets will be available at check-in.

MEET FORMAT: Prelim/Final meet with 24 events as set forth on the "Order of Events". There will be a championship & consolation heat (top 16) for all swimming events. The top 16 divers will return for finals. All events will be pre-seeded. For the Finals Session: All swimming and diving championship finalists will report to the ready area (hallway next to the locker rooms). Consolation finalists will report to the blocks.

WARM-UP RULES & ASSIGNMENTS:

Southeastern Swimming safety guidelines and warm-up procedures will be in effect. **Coaches of multiple high school teams must request their teams to be assigned to the same warm-up. Teams may also request warm-up times on Thursday on a first-come, first served basis when filling out the 2019 TISCA Team Information Online Form: <https://goo.gl/forms/zVIm3VyQ5mtBbgq72>.** Warm-Up assignments will be posted on the NAC website when available and included in the team packets.

ENTRIES: Each competitor may enter a maximum of four (4) events, no more than two (2) of which may be individual events and must have met the qualifying time in any entered event during the current season. A team is allowed four (4) scoring entries in each individual event. Teams are limited to one (1) scoring "A" relay per event. The "A" relay must consist of at least two members entered in at least one individual swimming event. Note: Diving is not considered an individual swimming event for purposes of this rule. One non-scoring "B" relay may also be entered with an entry time and must be designated as such on the entry. All members of a "B" relay must be qualified and entered in the meet in an individual swimming event. In relay events 8 individuals may be designated on the entry. Each school/team may enter a maximum of four (4) men and four (4) women as "Relay Only" swimmers (implemented February 11, 2012). These swimmers may compete on "A" relays only. If a diver wishes to participate as a qualified member of an "A" relay team, they must qualify in a "swimming" event. If diver does not meet this qualification, they may be included as "Relay Only" swimmers. "Relay Only" swimmers must be entered on the relay in the original entry. A "Relay Only" swimmer is a swimmer who is not entered in any individual swimming events. To declare a swimmer as "Relay Only" in the Team Manager software, click on the Entered check box next to the swimmer's name and then right mouse click. TM will ask you to confirm that you wish to enter this swimmer as a "Relay Only" swimmer." Click OK and the "Relay Only" swimmer entry will be stored in your database and the column to the left of the swimmer's name will be listed with a @ character to indicate the "Relay Only" status. "Relay Only" swimmers will be displayed in the Meet Entry Report sorted "by name" with the "Individual and Relay" box checked.

ENTRY TIMES: Enter with best SHORT COURSE YARDS times achieved in competition during the current high school season.

ENTRY TIME VERIFICATION: A swimmer who does not attain the qualifying time for an event during competition in this championship meet will be required to provide proof of entered time. The only valid proof of time will be official meet results from the meet where the time was attained. Failure to provide entry time verification within 30 days of the meet will result in a \$25 fine charged to the team per instance. Once 30 days have passed, then proofs will no longer be accepted and fines must be paid. Times may be proved and/or fines may be paid at the meet venue. **Please note that a team will not be allowed to participate in future TISCA Championship Swim Meets until all outstanding fines have been paid.** Official meet results are defined as results achieved in high school competition or meets such as USA Swimming, AAU, or YMCA meets. "Exhibition" swims should be shown as part of the official meet results. A certified official who was present must sign Time Trial results. Team Manager reports are not valid proofs of time.

ELECTRONIC ENTRIES ONLY: All swimming and diving entries must be submitted via email using Hy-Tek Team Manager/Team Manager Lite or Team Unify. **USE THE ASSIGNED TISCA STATE MEET TEAM ABBREVIATION FOR YOUR SCHOOL** The downloadable Team Manager EVENT FILE is available on the TISCA website <http://www.tisca.net/> and Nashville Aquatic Club website at www.swimnac.com.

USA SWIMMING OBSERVED STATUS: This meet has been approved for Observation of USA Swimming technical rules. USA SWIMMING OBSERVED TIMES Application for approval for Observation of USA Swimming technical rules has been submitted. If the meet is approved, those swimmers who are entered into the meet database with accurate USA-S ID numbers will have all times from legal USA-S swims automatically loaded into the national times database. The athlete’s correct USA Swimming ID#, registered full name with middle initial and date of birth must be included in the TM entry. For those USA-S swimmers without USA-S ID’s or inaccurate ID #’s, a written request must be submitted. Lead off splits for individual events and relays must be specifically requested in writing. Requests must be made by submission of the SES Individual Verification Request Form by the athlete or coach within two weeks of the last day of the meet (February 24, 2018) and submitted to the SES SWIMS Chair. Email requests are not acceptable. Forms are available at: www.seswim.org An LSC administrative fee of \$5.00 per athlete, payable to SES, Inc. must be submitted with the request. Note: Late fees of \$10 per athlete must be submitted for requests after the two week time limit. SE Swimming, Attn: Tom Healey, 327 East Longleaf Dr, Auburn, AL 36832.

DIVING COMPETITION: Divers are required to dive in and complete at least three dive meets, at least one being an 11-dive meet, during the current high school swimming/diving season in order to be eligible to dive in the TISCA Championship Meet. All divers should have their score sheets showing successful completion of three dive meets available in case of any eligibility question. There will be three stages of competition: preliminaries, semi-finals and finals. There will be a minimum of five judges and one referee present for the competition. Competition will consist of five voluntary dives and six optional dives, which may be performed in any order within each stage of competition. The five voluntary dives must come from each of the five groups and the sum total of their assigned degrees of difficulty must be 9.0 or less. The six optional dives must include at least one dive chosen from each of the five groups. All five groups of dives must be represented in the preliminary and semi-final rounds (first eight dives). The dives to be performed during each stage of the championship competition shall be as follows:

Preliminaries (rounds 1-5): Any two voluntary dives, any three optional dives. If there are more than 32 divers, the field will be reduced to the top 32 following round 3 (at the discretion of the Diving Director). The top twenty divers will advance to the semi-finals. **Semi-finals (rounds 6-8):** Two voluntary dives, one optional dive (this dive must be from a different group than those in the preliminaries). The top sixteen divers will advance to the finals. **Finals (rounds 9-11):** One voluntary dive, two optional dives.

DIVING SCORE SHEETS: Diving score sheets for **Women** must be submitted, signed by the coach and the diver, written in pencil, by 9:30 am, **Friday, February 8, 2019**. **Men** divers must submit score sheets, by 9:30 am, **Saturday, February 9, 2019**. An entry box will be available at the Diving Scoring table. Score sheets will NOT be accepted after the deadline. Changes are permitted until 60 minutes prior to the start of the diving competition. The dive number for the voluntary dives must be circled on the diving form. Diving score sheets will also be accepted during the open warm-up on Thursday, February 8, 2019. **ALL DIVERS MUST BE ENTERED IN HY-TEK OR TEAM UNIFY FILE THAT IS SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY.** If you have questions about entering your diver in hy-tek please contact entry@swimnac.com.

SCORING: Scoring will be 20-17-16-15-14-13-12-11-9-7-6-5-4-3-2-1. Points will be awarded for first through sixteenth place for individual swimming and diving events. Double points will be awarded for relay events.

AWARDS: There will be individual awards for the top sixteen athletes in each individual and relay event. Medals for 1-16 will be awarded. Trophies will be presented to the top 10 teams in the Men's & Women's divisions. The Ray Bussard Combined Team Championship Award will be presented to the top 10 combined teams. Awards will be given out each evening throughout the course of finals on deck at the awards stand.

Additional awards to be presented at the completion of the Finals Session on Saturday:

- Female Swimmer of the Year
- Male Swimmer of the Year
- Men's Swimming Coach of the Year
- Women's Swimming Coach of the Year
- Female Diver of the Year
- Male Diver of the Year
- Diving Coach of the Year

ALL STATE AWARDS: Swimmers and Divers will be recognized by TISCA as "All State" by placing 1st through 4th in an individual or relay event. Awards for All State will be mailed to the athlete's team after the competition.

ANNUAL TISCA BUSINESS MEETING: The annual TISCA Business Meeting will be held **60 minutes** after the conclusion of Friday's Preliminary session at the following location:

Because food is not allowed in the meeting room, coaches should first eat lunch provided in the hospitality room at the Sportsplex before heading over to the TISCA meeting. Elections and rule proposals will be voted on. Each team is highly encouraged to send a representative! TISCA is a Coach-run organization, and participation by our coach members is paramount to sustaining our mission.

General Information

PARKING: Parking will be FREE. Parking will be available in the Centennial Sportsplex parking lot, on the streets surrounding the facility, and in Centennial Park. It is important to read and obey all signs posted in these areas as parking at your own risk could subject cars to being towed.

USE OF AUDIO/VISUAL:

Use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas and in the rest rooms or locker rooms. The use of drones is not allowed. **Teams who wish to have a credentialed videographer and/or photographer on deck to film or photograph races will need to obtain a credential in order for them to gain access to the pool deck. Photographs and videos are not permitted from behind the blocks.**

DECK CHANGE RULE:

Except where venue facilities require otherwise, changing into or out of swimsuits other than in locker rooms or other designated areas is prohibited.

FACILITY RULES: Only Swimmers, Coaches and Meet Personnel shall be on the pool deck at any time. Credentials must be shown for access to the pool deck at all times. Wristbands must be worn on the wrist by all coaches for access to the pool deck at all times. No food or drink (with the exception of water bottles) may be brought into the pool area. No chairs may be setup in between or in front of the bleachers, including along the railing.

SPECTATOR SEATING:

Spectator seating is in the elevated bleacher area only. **Spectators will only be permitted to stand along the rail during their swimmer's race.** We ask that you do not remain standing at the rail for an extended period of time. No flash photography at the start of races. **Saving seats or leaving items on bleachers between sessions is strictly prohibited. Bleachers will be cleared by the facility staff at the completion of each session of the meet, including diving, and the entrance doors to the pool area will be locked. All items left on the bleachers will be placed into "lost and found".**

The doors will open prior to each session as follows:

- Friday & Saturday Prelims – 6:30 AM
- Friday & Saturday Finals – 4:30 PM

ADMISSIONS: Teams are allowed one complimentary coach/chaperone wristband for every six (6) competitors entered. Additional wristbands will not be given out for teams unless they have listed additional coaches on the **2019 TISCA Team Information Online Form** and paid for them in advance at team check-in.

WEEKEND PASSES will be available to purchase **ONLINE ONLY** at a price of **\$24**. The online sale will run January 15th through February 6th at <https://squareup.com/store/nashville-aquatic-club>

Spectator passes will be available for sale on site in the Sportsplex lobby beginning Thursday, February 7 from 4:00 pm – 7:00 pm and then again on Friday and Saturday morning beginning at 6:30 am. Finals only passes may be purchased each evening beginning at 4:30 pm. **Spectator passes will be \$12 per day or \$6 per session when purchased on site.**

BANNERS: The Centennial Sportsplex Facility Staff will hang all banners in the order in which they are received. **Teams must turn banners in by 7pm on Thursday, February 7 to the Centennial Sportsplex Aquatics Office.** Zip ties will be used to hang banners. **Individual teams are responsible for cutting down and taking their team banner with them at the end of the meet.** Metro Parks staff will assist in taking down banners in any way necessary. Banners will not be stored at the facility after the meet.

RESULTS: Real-Time results will be available on the NAC web site at www.SwimNAC.com. Electronic results will be running on the two television screens in the lobby of the Centennial Sportsplex.

SWIMSHOP: All American Swim Supply will be on site both days of the meet.

CONCESSIONS: Concessions will be available for sale in the Centennial Sportsplex lobby. No outside food or drinks may be brought into the building, No coolers may be brought into the building.

Incorporation of Paralympic Athletes into the Tennessee State High School Swimming and Diving Championship Meet

Philosophy and Rationale:

The Tennessee High School Swimming and Diving Championship Meet is the pinnacle interscholastic competition for swimmers and divers in the State. As such, participation requires a level of competitive competence. Such competence in swimming is shown by equaling or bettering established qualifying time standards in each event. Competence in diving requires successful completion of at least one 11-dive competition prior to the State Meet.

The TISCA body has determined that providing an avenue for disability athletes to participate in the State Championship Meet has benefits to not only the disability athletes but to the organization and its members. However, in order to maintain the competitive philosophy of the meet, disability athletes must meet certain qualifying criteria. In other words: ***Participation by disability athletes shall not be awarded merely because one has a disability. Rather, the right to participate in the State Championship Meet shall be awarded based on the performance of a given standard which takes into account an athlete's disability.***

Logistics

To participate in the Tennessee State High School Championship Swimming competition, a disability athlete shall:

1. Show proof of USA Paralympic Sports Class Impairment

Such classification is a formal procedure carried out by the USA Paralympic Committee. TISCA is not able to nor responsible for providing such classification. Simply stating that one has a disability is not sufficient. Only USA Paralympic Classification certification will be accepted. Provisional sport classification documented by US Paralympics will be accepted, as will a final National Classification.

To apply for Certification

1. Download the "Gateway to Gold" app and submit a video according to the app.

2. Submit an MDS form to Sherrice.Fox@usoc.org

US Paralympics will then assign a provisional sport classification. Actual participation and further evaluation steps at a recognized US Paralympic Meet is required to be assigned a formal National Certification. Events can be found at <http://www.teamusa.org/us-paralympics/sports/swimming/events>

2. Within the current high school season (ie: beginning on Sept 1), meet the current Can-Am Swimming Meet time standards for his/her disability category in the course distance in which the event was swum. Proof of time is required prior to State competition. The "current time standard" will be considered to be the Can-AM Meet standards posted on the USA Paralympic website as of September 1 prior to the TISCA State Championship in question. Additional Information

3. Meet all other TISCA eligibility requirements, including Championship Meet Entry requirements.

Events

Qualified disability swimmers may enter the 50 and/or 100-yard freestyle events at the meet for which they qualify. They will be seeded by time along with able-bodied swimmers in the competition. There will be no separate awards or scoring for disability events.

Accommodations

Prior to the meet, coaches and athletes are responsible for alerting the meet host and referee as to any accommodations, which may be required. Providing specialized accommodations (for example, a visually-impaired swimmer needing a tapper) is the responsibility of the athlete and/or coach.
